Combe Gibbet

27th March

It seems hard to believe, that due to the Covid Pandemic, the last time I ran the 16 miles back to Overton from the Gibbet was in 2019. I'm sure three years ago I told myself that was my last one.

As I have done in previous years, I prepared for this race by running sections of the course in the weeks leading up to the race and day before spending the morning driving to key locations to check course conditions. This has now become bit of a tradition and I become anxious on the day if I haven't done it.

In the weeks leading up to the race I was concerned it was going to be muddy and especially for the first five miles, which can make for a gruelling run. But luckily the warm weather in the week before dried the course out nicely. The conditions on the day were perfect for running and a fast time.

From the start of the race the two runners who finished in front of me, broke away at the front and gradually the gaps between us grew as the race went on. For most of the first half of the race, I was in third place, but on the decent to the A34 crossing I had a couple of runners close me down and one pass me. On the climb up Ladle Hill from the A34, course knowledge paid off and was able to take the place back and put some time between us. From that point I was running on my own and just had keep going to the finish to keep the position.

The race was won by Basingstoke and Mid Hants Athletic Club Runner Alex Hamilton who was nearly two minutes in front of the race winner last time it was held in 2019, Ben Pitman from Lordshill.

I finished third a further three minutes behind Ben. Now was that my last one...

This year, I want to break the repetitive cycle of the HRRL races and try some new ones.

There are so many local races and I want to run them for the enjoyment or challenge, not just to score or try and get a pb. Well, except for the 5k distance...

Dorney Lake 5k - 12th Feb

Following my surprising pb success at Stubbington 10k (39:32), and an unofficial 5k pb (19:31), I wanted to try a 5k.

I've done parkruns and track 5k's but I've never ran an official 5k race. What has surprised me is how difficult they are to find! Well, this time of year anyway.

I came across Dorney Lake. I'd been warned it is notoriously windy but a pb is still achievable. Well, I can confirm both!

The wind was horrendous! The final mile is a straight stretch of strong headwind! I gave it my all and achieved a pb of 19:18, 1st female and 3rd overall. Of course I am pleased, but after my performance at Stubbington and all the training I had been consistently attending, I was hoping for a sub 19. However, looking at my splits, it is obvious the wind really did make it a challenge! A great base for the year and hopefully a sub 19 will be in the future!

Englefield Multi-terrain 5k - 5th March

I did this race as I got a very cheap entry (under £10!), it's local and in a beautiful location.

The course was hilly and difficult underfoot (often running on uneven, long grass diagonally), but enjoyable!

Running around an estate house and through a deer park certainly made this a scenic course! And to top it off, I won the race!

Bushy Park 10k - 13th March

I have always wanted to run in Bushy Park and when this cheap race came up, I thought, why not? I didn't realise how close Bushy Park actually is, and now I understand why people go there to do their training runs.

The course was completely flat (literally not a single hill! Which is odd as in the description it says 'rolling hills') but it was still strangely tough!
