RESULTS

Stubbington 10k – 12th January 2025, Gareth

Having not fancied the 2 cross countries in consecutive weeks, my 1st race of 2025 was to be Stubbington. After the stress of parking last year, me and Halszka were there bright and early to find a spot in the already cramped hall to pick up our numbers and to be disappointed that there wasn't to be the usual free long sleeve top this year.

Having now been about 6 months injury free my target was to try to get back to around 43mins for 10k with the hope to then get myself near the 40 mins mark for the spring/summer 10ks with a few more strong training months.

With the 1st half of the course on a gradual downhill/flat trajectory I set off looking to stay a little below 7 min miles but as feeling good went through 3 miles between 6.30 and 6.40 miles. At the halfway mark although slowing on the 1st incline, I was pleased to be a about 20.30, which was way above schedule and faster than I had been running park runs for a few years. It was at point at the water station I attempted to drink out of a cup while still running (multi-tasking was never a strong suit) and had to stop to choke for a little bit.

With my composure back after about a half mile I did manage to get back into my rhythm even if the 2nd half is slightly harder, especially considering the effort I had put in. It was nice at about 4 and a half where runners are coming the other way to see some harriers to cheer on and forget about how hard the race is for a minute.

The end of the revised course for last few years is quite deceptive where come back on yourself but I had tried to push on a bit for about half a mile out. The finish though did still come up quicker than expected hence feel may have pushed slightly quicker and gained a few more places. I was though incredibly pleased to come in at 42mins dead so a minute above target.

A big shout out to all who run and know there were some big pbs on the day on what is to be fair a pb course. Is good to see some of our newer and younger members starting to get faster by competing with each other. Hopefully the more senior members like myself can also be inspired to get to a point I can get that elusive sub 40 mins 10k in the future.
